Covid 19 Update

I was hoping I may have an update from the Education Department by the end of term. At this stage, with the high cases in Victoria (mainly in Melbourne) I am not expecting any restrictions to be relaxed relating to schools. Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Program

As you are aware the SAKG program we run at our school is highly regarded and valued by our school community as it is a big part of our school. We are pleased to announce that we will be running the program once again in term 3, however, we are still not permitted to have any parents or volunteers assist. We have made some other arrangements to have staff help out as required. Therefore, if you paid for SAKG during term 2 (when it did not operate due to remote learning) you will not need to pay \$ 25 per student for term 3 as that money will carry over for term 3.

Also, at the beginning of the year we trialled giving families the option of paying for Terms 1, 2 and 3 of SAKG and they would then receive Term 4 for free. Due to Remote Learning occurring in Term 2 it was hard to deliver the full SAKG program for students. Therefore we have needed to alter how this will now work. There will be no charge for term 2. If you have paid for Term 1 and will be paying for Term 3 (or your term 2 money will be carried forward for term 3) then Term 4 SAKG will still be free for those families. For those families that have paid for all three terms already this money (\$25 per student for term 2) will be credited off other outstanding items. If your account was paid in full, the credit can be allocated to 2021 fees.












We have been notified by a concerned member of the public that students have not been acting safely on the road. It is important for all families to review road safety with your child/ren and remind them to use our school crossings.
