PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Upcoming Transition Events

Foundation transition days – Beginning on Tuesday, the 19th of November we will be welcoming all of our foundation students for 2025 into the school for the morning. They will attend the school for four Tuesdays in a row and gradually build up their time to almost a full day so that they can get to know the school and meet some other staff who will be working with them next year. The dates for these events are Tuesday 19th November 9.15am – 11am, Tuesday 26th November 9.15 am – 12pm, Tuesday 3rd December 9.15 am – 12pm and Tuesday 10th December 9.15 am – 2pm.

Whole school transition day - On Tuesday, the 10th of December the school will be hosting a whole school transition day. This is the time where all students get to move up a year level and work with a range of different teachers who may be their classroom teacher for the following year. The students will be split into three groupings and rotate between the teachers, so they have a chance to meet all of the teachers for that year level. It is also our hope that we will be able to have any new staff who will be joining our school for 2025 in attendance that day, so that families and students can get to meet them and show them what a great place it is to work and learn.

<u>Headstart week</u> - For all of our year six students attending Wodonga Middle years campus they will have a Headstart week from December 9 through to December 13. Our staff will be there to meet and greet the students on Monday morning for a short period of time before they get underway with the days activities. Then they will have the chance to spend the whole week on the school grounds getting to know the campus, meeting lots of different teachers and participating in lots of different classes and activities that will be on offer for them in year seven in 2025. Please make sure you have placed your enrolment with the college so that your child can attend these sessions.

Student Requests 2025

In the upcoming weeks, our staff will begin to prepare the class placements for 2025. This process takes a lot of work and requires continual adjustments - especially as new enrolments come into the school before the end of the year. We ask that if you have a request for your child

to be placed in a class with a particular friend that these be addressed in writing to the principal and delivered to the school- No later than Friday, the 22nd of November. Please be aware that as our final staffing and allocation of teachers to grade levels is yet to be completed, you cannot request, a staff member for your child's teacher.

Remembrance Day

On Monday, November 11, our school will participate in the local Remembrance Day ceremony, along with the Wodonga community. This includes two of our SLC students, Omar Khan and Casey Ferguson laying a Remembrance Day wreath at the ceremony, which will occur at 11am at the water tower. At the same time, our students at school will participate in a small ceremony to acknowledge the significance of this day. Remembrance Day memorabilia are currently available for purchase from the school office.

Respect and consent

This week as a school community we have been following up with conversations with a range of students around consent.

Consent is an important topic which helps students manage relationships and understanding personal boundaries. Consent involves having permission to touch another person's body. As a school it is important that all of our students understand that no one has the right to touch anyone else without permission. This could include simple acts of contact including holding onto someone's hands, high fives, touching someone on the shoulder, asking for a hug or asking for other physical contact such as kissing etc. We will be following up with explicit teaching around consent in our respectful relationships program to help all of our students understand this important concept and make our school a safe and happy place for everyone.

Sun Smart Awareness

Now it is October the weather is warming up and we need to be more mindful of protecting ourselves and our children from the sun. In **Term 1 and Term 4 our school implements a no hat no play** policy to ensure all children are protected rom sun exposure. Please make sure you child has their green broad brimmed hat every day in their bag so they can enjoy their breaks!



Too much of the sun's ultraviolet (UV) radiation can cause sunburn, skin and eye damage and skin cancer.

UV damage accumulated during childhood and adolescence is associated with an increased risk of skin cancer later in life. Skin cancer is the most common cancer in Australia. It is also one of the most preventable cancers.

You can't see or feel the sun's UV. Whatever the weather, if the UV levels are three or more, it's important to Slip, Slop, Slap, Seek and Slide!

Sun protection times

Don't just wait for hot and sunny days to use sun protection. Check the sun protection times each day so your family can be protected when they need to be.

SunSmart membership

Our school is a registered member of Cancer Council Victoria's SunSmart Schools Program. We aim to protect children and staff from too much UV.

Sun protection and skin cancer prevention is a shared responsibility. Please help support our SunSmart membership and sun protection efforts by ensuring your child follows the SunSmart measures included in our policy at school and at home.

During the daily local sun protection times (usually from mid-August to the end of April), use these 5 SunSmart steps – even if it's cool and cloudy.

1. SLIP on covering clothing

For free dress days, ensure your child wears clothing that covers as much skin as possible (e.g. elbow length tops with a higher neckline or collar and longer style shorts or skirts). Densely woven fabrics are best.



2. SLOP on SPF30 (or higher) broadspectrum, water-resistant sunscreen

Apply a generous amount of sunscreen at the start of the day and make sure children have sunscreen in their bag ready to reapply throughout the day. Sunscreen should be reapplied every two hours. Please ensure children get plenty of sunscreen application practice at home so they'll be all set when they are at school. Under supervision, ask children to put a dot of sunscreen on each cheek, nose and chin and rub it in (avoiding the eye area) and sunscreen squiggles or dots on the back of the neck, arms and legs to cover these areas.

3. SLAP on a hat that protects the face, neck and ears

Choose a wide-brimmed, legionnaire or bucket hat. Peak caps and visors do not offer enough UV protection so please leave them at home. Please help your child remember to bring and wear their approved school hat. Please keep this at school so they will always be ready for outdoor activities, outdoor learning and play during school days. For the walk to and from school and weekends, please have an extra home hat to help keep children protected at home.

4. SEEK shade

Choose shady spots for learning and play whenever

SLIDE on wrap-around AS1067 sunglasses
 When appropriate and practical, help protect the eyes with sunglasses.




































KINDERGARTEN NEWS

With the playground renovations taking a little longer than anticipated, we have been venturing outside into the school grounds to get some fresh air and physical activity. The children have enjoyed playing games on the front lawn and going for walks around the school. As it is getting closer to the end of the year, transition to primary school is now becoming a strong focus within our Kindergarten. School readiness sessions have now started and will run over a 4-week period. These sessions are solely for those children attending primary school in 2025 and are run exactly like a school day. The day starts with the children lining up outside when the school bell rings, before being led into the kinder, just like the foundation arrival routine. Learning sessions then begin with the children completing structured tasks in handwriting, early literacy and numeracy. The children join the foundation students for lunch and spend play time in the school playground alongside the primary school students. Throughout the week, they also spend time learning in the foundation classrooms when they are vacant. These experiences all complement out transition to school process.


